Section 1.

Chapter 220, Article XI, Section 220-71 of the Putnam County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 220-71. Amount of Exemption.

The maximum exemptions allowable from County real property taxation pursuant to Section 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law shall be 15% of the property's assessment, not to exceed $\frac{12,000}{54,000}$ multiplied by the latest final state equalization rate for service during the "Cold War" and a percentage of the property's assessment equal to one-half of any service connected disability rating not to exceed $\frac{54,000}{180,000}$ multiplied by the latest final state equalization.

Section 2.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing with the Secretary of State.

Item #6k – Approval/Worker's Compensation Settlement was next. On behalf of the members of the Audit & Administration Committee, Legislators Jonke and Sullivan, Legislator Castellano moved the following:

RESOLUTION #40

APPROVAL/WORKER'S COMPENSATION SETTLEMENT

WHEREAS, on or about July 30, 2010, the claimant, Jerome Odell, (hereinafter "claimant"), while employed by Putnam County in the Department of Highways, Facilities and Parks, began experiencing pain throughout his right shoulder after shoveling and sweeping the edge of pavement; and

WHEREAS, on or about May 21, 2015, the claimant, while employed by Putnam County in the Department of Highways, Facilities and Parks, once again began experiencing pain throughout his right shoulder while raking blacktop; and

WHEREAS, the claimant received medical treatment as a result of said injuries, including surgery; and

WHEREAS, the parties began negotiations as a result of the difference in the medical opinions regarding the scheduled loss of use; and

WHEREAS, claimant is no longer seeking treatment and is desirous of entering into an agreement with the County, subject to the Legislature's approval, in which the County would agree to pay the sum of Eighty Four Thousand Five Hundred Forty Seven dollars and one cent (\$84,547.01) representing a 35% scheduled loss of use of the right shoulder apportioned 50% to the 2010 case and 50% to the 2015 case; and

WHEREAS, the Law Department and the County's third party administrator, POMCO Group, both recommend the settlement, as there is a difference of medical opinion and if a hearing is conducted, it would likely result in the claimant's favor; and

WHERAS, POMCO Group, through its claims representative, has in fact settled the matter with the claimant for the sum of Eighty Four Thousand Five Hundred Forty Seven Dollars and One Cent (\$84,547.01) and has obtained settlement documents, which, upon approval of the Putnam County Legislature and the Worker's Compensation Board, will discontinue this matter with the Court; and

WHEREAS, the settlement is in the public interest and will avoid additional exposure and expense; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the settlement of this matter for the sum of Eighty Four Thousand Five Hundred Forty Seven Dollars and One Cent (\$84,547.01) is approved; and be it further

RESOLVED, that from said settlement the County will be reimbursed Ten Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Two Dollars and Eighty One Cents (\$10,422.81) for time paid to claimant and the claimant will receive the remainder less his attorney fees of Eleven Thousand (\$11,000.00) in full settlement of this matter; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Claimant shall therefore receive Sixty Three Thousand One Hundred Twenty Four Dollars and Twenty Cents (\$63,124.20) in full settlement of this matter; and be it further

RESOLVED, that Commissioner Carlin is hereby directed to pay such settlement, if approved by the Worker's Compensation Board, from the Six Fund.
