## **Tuesday**

**December 13, 2022** 

The meeting was called to order at 6:34PM by Chairwoman Nacerino who requested Legislator Sayegh lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislator Sayegh and Chairwoman Nacerino were present. Legislator Sullivan was absent.

## Item #3 - Approval/ Protective Services Meeting Minutes/ November 17, 2022

Chairwoman Nacerino stated the minutes were accepted as submitted.

## Item #4 – Approval/ Fund Transfer – 22T344/ Lights for the Bureau of Emergency Services 2022 Tahoe/ Bureau of Emergency Services Commissioner Ken Clair

Deputy Commissioner Bureau of Emergency Services Lipton stated this is a request for funding that will outfit a new vehicle purchased in June of 2022. He stated they researched and found a company that carries what is needed and at a good price.

Legislator Sayegh questioned if this will cover the installation as well.

Deputy Commissioner Bureau of Emergency Services Lipton confirmed it does.

Chairwoman Nacerino made a motion to approve Fund Transfer – 22T344/ Lights for the Bureau of Emergency Services 2022 Tahoe; Seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

## Item#5 - Approval/ Re-new the Community Engagement and Police Advisory Board (CEPAB)/ CEPAB Board Members

Chairwoman Nacerino stated the CEPAB Board sent her as Chair of this committee a letter stating their intention to continue the CEPAB for another year. She read the letter and the resolution into the record.

Legislator Montgomery questioned if the appointments to the board need to be approved/confirmed by the Legislature.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated he believes there may have been some initial appointments. He stated once they established their own board and adopted their own by-laws the board became completely independent.

Legislator Sayegh stated the CEPAB did receive their 501C status this year. She stated they are a not-for-profit and are able to establish their own board and by-laws, as Legislative Counsel stated.

Legislator Albano stated his support for the CEPAB and the work they do.

Chairwoman Nacerino made a motion to Approve Renewal of the Community Engagement and Police Advisory Board (CEPAB); Seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

Item#6 - Approval/ Authorization for Intermunicipal Agreement with Certain Putnam County Municipalities to Effectuate A Mutual Aid And Rapid Response Plan For The Police Departments Of Participating Municipalities (If approved move to the 2023 Jan Org Mtg)/ Sheriff McConville

Sheriff McConville stated that they are requesting review of the signatory on the proposed mutual aid plan. He stated Putnam County does not have a mutual aid plan amongst its law enforcement. He explained on a day-to-day basis law enforcement has provided aid and assistance to each other. He stated this Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA) is for more serious matters. He stated he has met with all the local Town Police Departments: Carmel, Kent, and Villages: Brewster and Cold Spring. He stated that they are in favor of this. He stated if/when it is passed at the County level they will then go to each municipality and they will sign off after they are given a presentation with their legislative bodies. He explained that he was one of the initial authors of this proposal in Westchester County after September 11, 2001. He stated this IMA includes personnel response, equipment, tactical and various intel resources.

Chairwoman Nacerino stated this is a confidential matter. She stated if any Legislators have a question, they can ask it but be aware it may be determined that it an Executive Session is necessary.

Legislator Sayegh questioned if there will be a cost to the County.

Sheriff McConville stated there is no cost involved.

Legislator Sayegh questioned how would overtime be handled.

Sheriff McConville stated each police department is responsible for their employee's overtime. He elaborated that the answer will also be scenario driven, depending on what the incident is. He stated there may be incidents when State or Federal funding can be utilized to cover overtime expenditures. He offered a few different scenarios for clarification.

Chairwoman Nacerino facilitated further discussion.

Legislator Montgomery questioned if this plan has been presented by the Sheriff to the elected officials in the Towns and Villages.

Sheriff McConville stated it was shared with all the municipalities police departments to have a discussion with their government.

Legislator Montgomery stated the Mayors and Supervisors are responsible and should see this as they are the ones who will be singing it.

Chairwoman Nacerino stated the Sheriff said that this is the first step. He explained then each municipality will need to execute it as well. She stated Sheriff McConville also stated that the Intermunicipal Agreement has been shared with each of the law enforcement departments and they are to share it with their Town/Village representatives.

Legislator Montgomery stated her recommendation is before the Legislature adopts this Intermunicipal Agreement, the County should wait to see if there is any feedback from the Towns and/or Villages. She noted a section of the Intermunicipal Agreement that she believed was unclear.

Legislator Albano stated if any of the municipalities have feedback, they can provide it. He stated his support for the County moving forward with this.

Sheriff McConville stated this has been shared with the local police department and they have voiced their acceptance and approval. He stated they were each asked to share the Intermunicipal Agreement with their governmental leaders and to set up meetings with their governmental leaders so they, himself, and any member of his command staff could discuss said document as they review it and prepare to bring it forth for resolution in their operations.

Legislator Montgomery expressed her request that the Intermunicipal Agreement be shared by the Sheriff and/or the Legislature, since we are the ones asking them to do this.

Chairwoman Nacerino stated the Sheriff has stated the process that he has put in place. She stated she is confident that if there is feedback from the municipalities it will be communicated. She stated law enforcement, those with the expertise, were part of the creation of the Intermunicipal Agreement. She stated she is satisfied with the process Sheriff McConville has shared with us. She requested that Legislative Counsel Firriolo provide his professional opinion on this process.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated as long as the Intermunicipal Agreement gets to the interested parties, the process is appropriate. He stated it began with the working groups and made its way to the Legislature and the Chief Executives. He stated he does not see this as being the County of Putnam's responsibility to send it to the municipalities Executives and Legislature. He stated the implementing agencies will seek approval from who they need to get their approval from. He stated he agrees with Legislator Montgomery that this needs to be signed by each of the Executives and approved by the Legislative Body of each participating municipality.

Legislator Sayegh questioned at what point does the Intermunicipal Agreement go to the Towns to be signed. She stated if this gets approved tonight it will go to the January Organizational

meeting of the Legislature. She questioned if after that, does it go to the Towns and Villages for signature.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo explained with a legal agreement that is executed in counter parts, which is what this is considered, the order of signature does not matter. He stated once all the signatories have signed it or have opted not to, the Intermunicipal Agreement becomes effective between the signing entities. He stated unless there is something specific in the agreement that states everyone needs to sign it.

Chairwoman Nacerino made a motion to Approve and move to the January 2023 Organizational Meeting the Authorization for Intermunicipal Agreement with Certain Putnam County Municipalities to Effectuate A Mutual Aid And Rapid Response Plan For The Police Departments Of Participating Municipalities; Seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

I am pleased to inform you that Putnam County is awarded \$234,731 under the FY2022 State Homeland Security Program (SHSP). Funding for this grant is provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (DHSES) will administer this funding on behalf of FEMA.

As per federal guidelines, at least 30 percent (\$70,419) of your award must be directed towards law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. The performance period for this grant is from September 1, 2022, through August 31, 2025. Grant extensions beyond this date are highly unlikely. DHSES grants management staff will work with your designated SHSP grant program point of contact to provide additional administrative guidance in executing this award.

### I. INTRODUCTION

The New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) seeks applications from law enforcement agencies to fund body-worn carneras (BWC) and applicable software/equipment. Approximately (ten million dollars) \$10,000,000 is expected to be available to fund BWCs and applicable equipment/software for local law enforcement agencies outside of New York City.

Body-worn cameras are intended to improve police officer interactions with the public and serve as an integrated part of an agency's problem-solving and community-engagement strategy, helping to increase public trust and communication. This funding will support up to 5,000 new BWCs. Funding will be prioritized to equip those departments/agencies that currently do not have a BWC program or have a BWC program that is being expanded, as well as those jurisdictions where the demonstrated need is greatest based on survey responses collected earlier this year by DCJS.

DCJS enhances public safety by providing resources and services that inform decision making and improve the quality of the criminal justice system. DCJS is a multi-function criminal justice support agency with a variety of responsibilities, including collection and analysis of statewide crime data; operation of the DNA databank and criminal fingerprint files; administration of federal and state criminal justice funds; identifying and funding programs that reduce crime, recidivism, and victimization. Additionally, DCJS administers the state's Sex Offender Registry. DCJS conducts research on critical criminal justice issues and provides training, legal guidance and regulation to the State's law enforcement, community corrections and prosecutorial communities.

DCJS is committed to providing programs that improve the effectiveness of New York's criminal justice system. Applications will be selected for funding consistent with the best interest of the state.

### II. BODY-WORN CAMERA PROGRAM INFORMATION

Throughout New York and the United States, law enforcement agencies are deploying BWCs to increase the safety of, and improve interactions between, officers and the public, as well as to collect potentially useful evidence.

BWCs also are proving to be an important tool to assist broader law enforcement, problemsolving, and community engagement strategies within jurisdictions across the state and country.

This deployment of BWCs is intended to improve police officer interactions with the public and serve as an integrated part of a law enforcement agency's problem-solving and community-engagement strategy, helping to increase public trust and communication.

All funded departments/agencies must have a BWC policy in place that meets or exceeds the provisions set forth in the Municipal Police Training Council's (MPTC) Body-Worn Camera Model Policy published by the NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services. See <u>MPTC "Body-Worn Camera Model Policy," issued September 2015</u>.

Awards will be granted to each individual applicable department/agency that is selected for an award. There will be no contracts executed between DCJS and individual award recipients. Payment will be issued directly to award recipients in the amounts approved by DCJS.

## III. FUNDING INFORMATION AND ELIGIBILITY

## A. Funding

Approximately \$10,000,000 will be made available to support the body-worn camera program. Funding under this program must supplement, not supplant, non-grant funds that would otherwise be available for expenditure on the programs proposed.

## 1. Availability and Approved Use of State Funds

All awards are subject to the availability of funds. Applicants should anticipate that awards under this initiative are one-time awards and should propose project activities and deliverables that can be accomplished without additional and/or subsequent funding. Agencies receiving awards should plan for the institutionalization of the project after grant funds are no longer available, including any prerequisite training requirements. This is a one-time payment for body-worn cameras and software related to body-worn cameras, not for the continued maintenance of such.

Funding will be prioritized as follows:

- a. Departments/agencies having no BWCs or BWC program in place;
- Departments/agencies that have a BWC program in place, but need additional BWCs to expand it beyond a pilot or partial deployment of BWCs to applicable personnel, assignments, or units; and
- c. Departments/agencies that have a BWC program in place but need new or additional BWCs, or that have otherwise demonstrated a need based on survey responses collected earlier this year.

## B. Applicant Eligibility and Requirements

Eligible applicants include local law enforcement agencies (e.g., police departments and sheriff's offices) in jurisdictions in New York State outside of New York City.

Funding requests must be submitted on the attached Body-Worn Camera Application Form as: "Number of [BWC] Bundles Being Requested". Each bundle award amount will be up to \$2,000.

Awardees must be current with the required submission to DCJS of their Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) or Incident-Based Reports (IBR).

Awardees must have a BWC policy in place or in development that meets or exceeds the provisions set forth in the MPTC Body-Worn Camera Model Policy, which is referenced and linked above; such BWC policy must be in place by the time payment is issued.

Awardees must have a State Financial Services (SFS) vendor ID registered with New York State or must have an SFS number by the time payment is issued.

## IV. APPLICATION/FORM INFORMATION

Applicants must electronically submit the attached Body-Worn Camera Application as instructed. If DCJS does not receive the attached form, the applicant will not receive funding. Please be sure all fields are complete before submission.

## V. NOTIFICATION OF AWARDS

Applicants approved for funding will be notified in writing by DCJS via email to the email address provided in the attached application form.

### VI. PAYMENT

If selected for funding, each individual agency/department shall receive a one-time payment for their entire award as determined by DCJS.

Based on survey results that DCJS conducted of law enforcement agencies in early 2022, DCJS contacted the NYS Office of General Services (OGS) regarding their state contract for the purchase of Body-Worn Camera equipment. 
