#### VETO/ \$50,000 Adjustment in Printing & Forms (Board of Elections)

This modification made by the Legislature was discussed in the Rules Budget Committee Meeting on October 11, 2023, and the Budget and Finance Committee Meeting on October 19, 2023. Upon further discussion with both Commissioners of the Board of Elections (BOE) in which they shared additional information that had not been presented at the initial department budget meeting, I agree with the Legislature that additional funding to support the printing & forms budget line during the 2024 Presidential Election year is indeed warranted. However, a 50% increase to this line is unprecedented and the BOE was unable to provide adequate details to the Legislature during the Budget & Finance Committee Meeting or to the Administration on how they formulated this number.

I have since discussed this specific budget item with both Commissioners of the Board of Elections. Based on their projections, as an alternative, they shared that they would feel comfortable with a \$25,000 increase to this line, instead of \$50,000, which would still allow them to adequately prepare for the 2024 Elections.

In lieu of Putnam County's Charter not affording the County Executive the power of exercising a line-item reduction veto, I am vetoing this modification in its entirety. This will have the effect of bringing the budgeted line back to the amount budgeted in the 2024 Tentative Budget. I would like to express my support for a subsequent budgetary amendment by the Legislature that would increase the line by \$25,000 (instead of \$50,000) from the General Fund as an alternative and generate \$25,000 in savings.
